



THE GRAND TOUR: CAIRO & BANGKOK



Shepheard's Hotel, in Cairo, Egypt, 1841. Destroyed by fire of 1952. "One of the most famous hotels in the world". Famous for its grandeur.



Oriental Hotel, Bangkok, Thailand. Opened in 1887 (Country was then Siam). Its famous Author's House stayed in by Joseph Conrad, Noel Coward and Somerset Maugham.

THE GRAND TOUR: SINGAPORE & HK



Raffles Hotel, Singapore, opened 1887. Named after Sir Thomas Stamford Raffles, founder of colonial-era Singapore. Famous for its Long Bar and the Gin Sling cocktail..



The Peninsula Hotel, Hongkong, opened 1928. "Finest Hotel East of Suez". Famous for its fleet of Rolls-Royces and once a haunt of Hollywood Film Stars.

LONDON GRAND HOTELS



Ritz Hotel, opened 1906, famous for its Palm Court and "Tea at the Ritz". One of the earliest steel-framed London structures.



Midland Grand Hotel, completed 1876 for the Midland Railway Company. Fronts St Pancras Railway Station.

LONDON GRAND HOTELS



Grosvenor Hotel, opened in 1929. First London Hotel to have a bathroom for every bedroom. Once famous for its Great Room, originally an ice-rink.



The Langham Hotel of 1865, with 100 water-closets and 36 bathrooms. Said to have England's first hydraulic passenger lift.



The Grand Hotel, Stockholm, opened 1874. 300 rooms.



Grand Hotel Krasnapolsky, Amsterdam. Opened 1865. 451 rooms. Has a canal pier for boats.



Principe e Savoia Hotel, Milan. Opened 1927. 301 rooms. Famous guests include Queen Elizabeth and The Duke of Edinburgh.



Hotel Alfonso XIII, Seville. 1929. 147 rooms. 6 banqueting halls. Built for the Ibero-American Exposition of 1929.



Grand Hotel of Europe, Salzburg, 1866. Advertised private Baths and a 45 hp Mercedes.



The Grand Hotel in Cannes opened in 1864. Demolished and rebuilt 1958.



Hotel Bristol, Paris, built 1720, hotel from 1878. (Edward VII at the window). Famous Hollywood guests include Charlie Chaplin and Rita Hayworth.




The Hotel Continental and Hotel of the Ocean, on the Sea Wall, Ostend (both built 1890).

Grand Hotel Excelsior Regina, Nice, Built 1897.




Hotel San Remo, Italy, built 1872.

Hotel de Crillon, Paris, built 1765, became hotel 1909, with fireplace.




Hotel Meurice, Paris, founded 1817, enlarged 1830 & 1907.




Hotel Adlon, Berlin, 1907, 305 bedrooms

GRAND HOTEL BATHROOMS






Hotel Majestic, Paris 1908.




Hotel Majestic, Paris, 1908, but with a bath from a former residence of Queen Isabel of Spain.






The Herzog Teleseme (multiple telegraph) in the Elysee Hotel, Paris (built in 1898).

HEATING IN A GRAND HOTEL




Hotel Adlon, Berlin, built 1907, monumental chimney piece with fire. Hotel destroyed in the war.


Original building converted to hotel 1909: Crillon Hotel, Paris, Dining Room.




Kitchens in the Astoria Hotel, Brussels (Built in 1900).






Kitchens in Grand Hotel du Louvre, Paris (Built 1855).

In the Main Stores of the Ciga Hotel Chain in Venice.




The Bottling Plant and Wine Cellars of the Ciga Company (Hotel Chain, Venice).


Page boy, cooks and wine-waiter at the Paris Ritz. (Built in 1704, converted to Hotel 1898).

SERVICES FOR HOTEL GUESTS



Grand Hotel, Paris, built 1862 (Later views from top: kitchens, wine cellar, ticket office, plant rooms with electricity generation- electric light backed up by 4000 gas jets). Hotel statistics: 800 bedrooms, 65 reception rooms, 600 staff, complete with hydraulic lift & telegraph system. Kitchens could cater for 2000 diners.

Laundry with Washing Machines & Steam Boilers, Hotel Adlon, Berlin (Hotel built 1907).









Menu card of the Grand Hotel in Turin, from 1908.




Dining Room of Hotel des Reservoirs, Versailles, France (photo of 1897).




