




Photograph c.1940. Skyscrapers in nearby Grant Street.


Photograph c.1910. Street view of the Flatiron Building.

#### **HOTEL SCHENLEY**




Photograph c.1900. Designed 1898 by Rutan and Russell. Became the William Pitt Student Union of the University of Pittsburgh in 1956.

#### PITTSBURGH WEST END MAIN STREET






1937 photograph with Allegheny River (left), Monongahela River (right).

### PORTLAND PANORMA TO MOUNT HOOD




1928 photograph, population 350,000. That of Metropolitan Area now around 2.5 million.

#### **HASELTINE BUILDING**




Photograph c.1910, built 1983 for a hardware merchant. Later Pick Warehouse.

## PORTLAND SOUTHWEST FOURTH AVENUE




1939 photograph. Busy with traffic and electric signs.

#### PIONEER SQUARE FROM JAMES STREET




1905 photograph showing the steep street with cable cars.

### SEATTLE BAYVIEW BREWERY




Photograph about 1915. The Seattle Brewing & Malting Company was founded in 1878.

#### **BOEING AIRPLANE FACTORY**




Photograph taken June 1917 of new factory Plant-1 after Boeing's first big order, its "C" model seaplane.

Construction started 1905 to celebrate move of Roman Catholic archdiocese from Vancouver. Opened 1907, a 14,000-seat building.
