










Photograph c.1868. The 5-storey building was completed in 1852, but torn down in 1903.


Photograph c.1880 with the third Trinity Church at end of street. Visible along the pavements are circular covers, believed over coal chutes to the cellars below.


Photograph c.1897. The 12-storey building of 1895 was torn down in 1974.


















