THE Cover of this catalogue bears a full-size reproduction of brass perforating and embossing, and the following pages contain other examples of the type of ornamental metalwork we undertake.

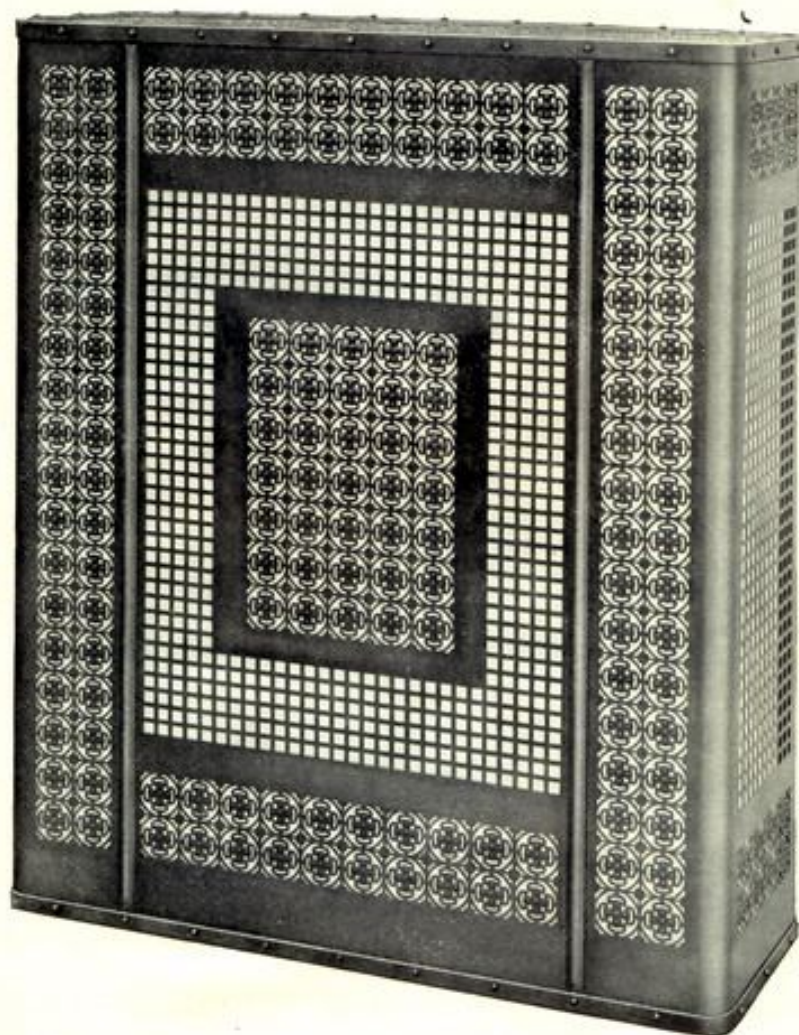
We have only reproduced a selection from our 3,000 different patterns in order to illustrate the quality of the workmanship. Every illustration is reproduced from an actual photograph, and in one or two instances two photographs have been mounted together in order to shew a finished article and a full-size piece of the pattern used.

These perforated designs possess the charm and distinction of the best hammered work, and offer a happy solution of the problem as to the best method of bringing the unsightly radiator, steam or hot-water piping, and ventilator opening into harmony with the general decorative scheme. It should be noted particularly that the artistic effect of these designs in no way impedes the proper functioning of any heating or ventilating system.

Produced from solid sheets of steel, brass, copper, bronze, duralumin, and, in fact, any metal, "Harvey" perforated and embossed metalwork, in addition to its decorativeness, has great strength and durability. Many effective designs can be obtained by using two or three of our patterns in combination, and several types of radiator covers can be fitted with marble, oak, or mahogany tops if desired.

HARVEY Ornamental Metalwork can be stove enamelled any colour desired or given any of the following finishes: *Polished Copper and Lacquered, Polished Brass and Lacquered, Satin Brass and Lacquered, Oxidised Copper Relieved and Lacquered (Bright or Dull), Oxidised Brass Relieved and Lacquered (Light, Medium, and Dark), Copper-Bronze and Lacquered (Light, Medium, and Dark), Antique Brass and Lacquered, Nickel Polished and Lacquered, Nickel Oxidised (Bright and Dull Relieved), Polished Silver, Antique Gold and Lacquered, and many other attractive effects to tone with decorative schemes.*

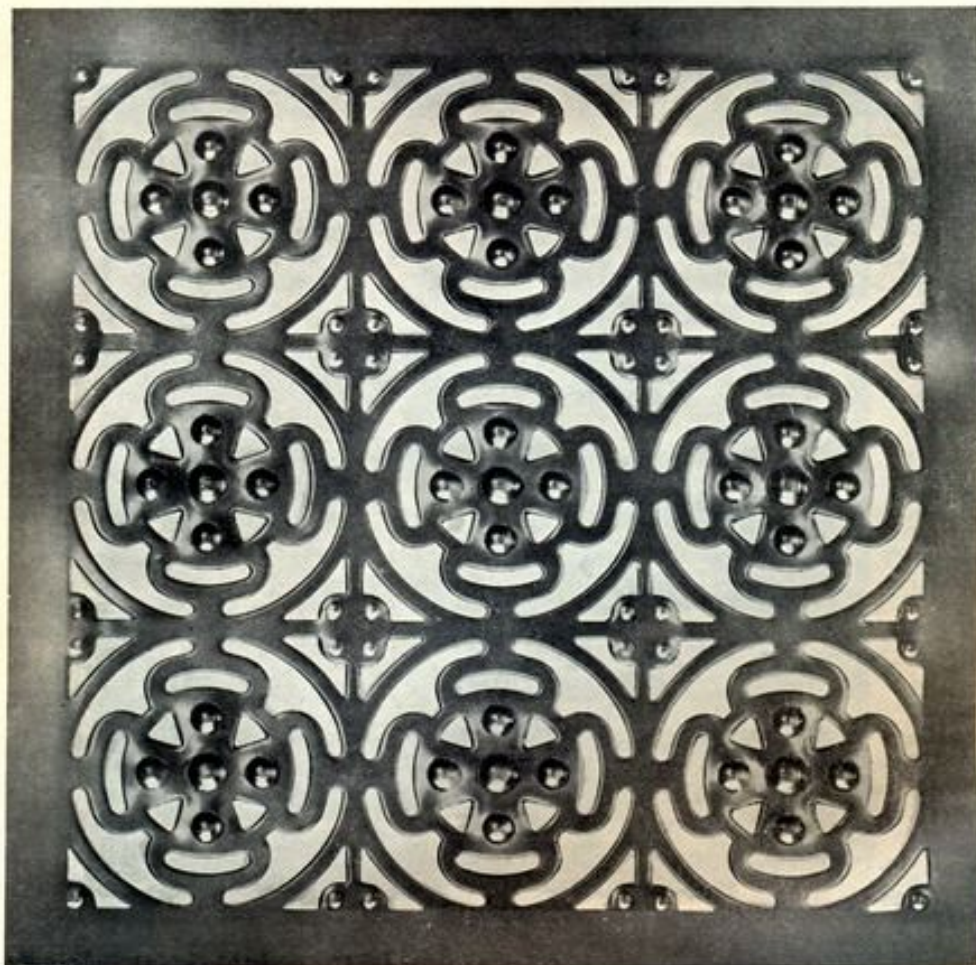
THE "ANTIQUE" RADIATOR COVER



This radiator cover was produced in Brass. Finished antique brass and lacquered. Panels of the two designs used are illustrated full size on pages four and five. It effectively screens the radiator and offers full protection; at the same time allowing free passage for the warm air to circulate.

Such a cover cannot but give added tone to any interior.*

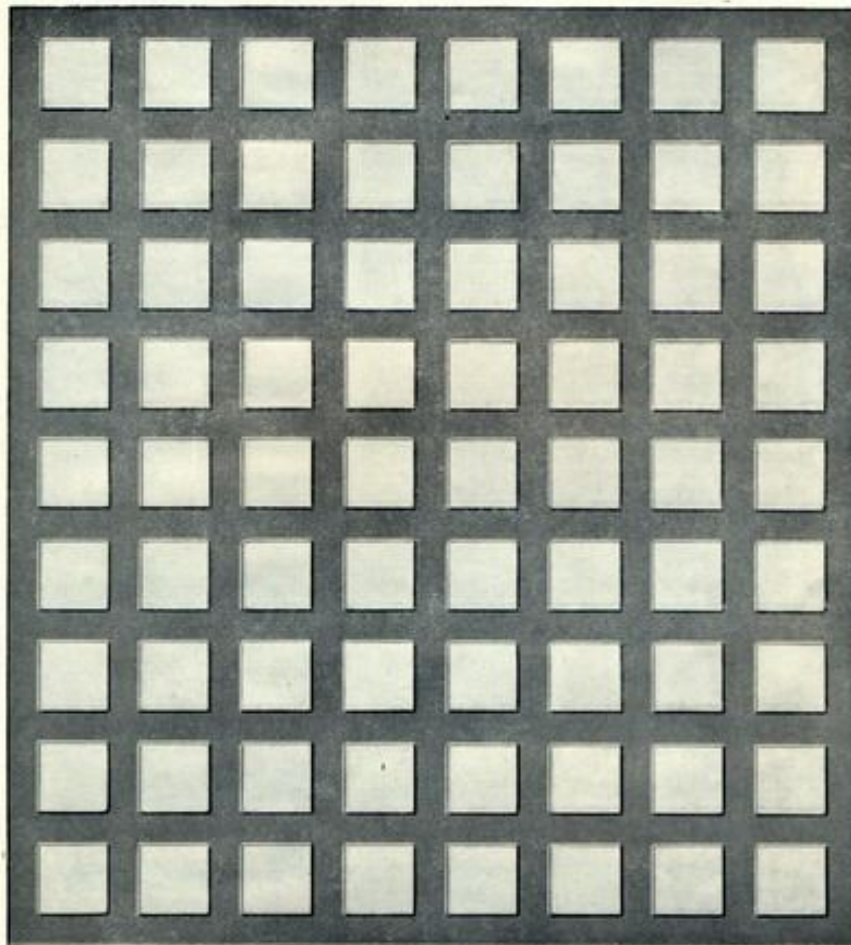
Full-Size Illustration of
THE "ROSE" PATTERN, NUMBER 1642



Both this and the illustration opposite are reproduced full size. It can therefore readily be seen that no obstruction is offered to the free passage of warm air, and the radiator is hidden by a screen which is decorative and, at the same time, affording ample protection.

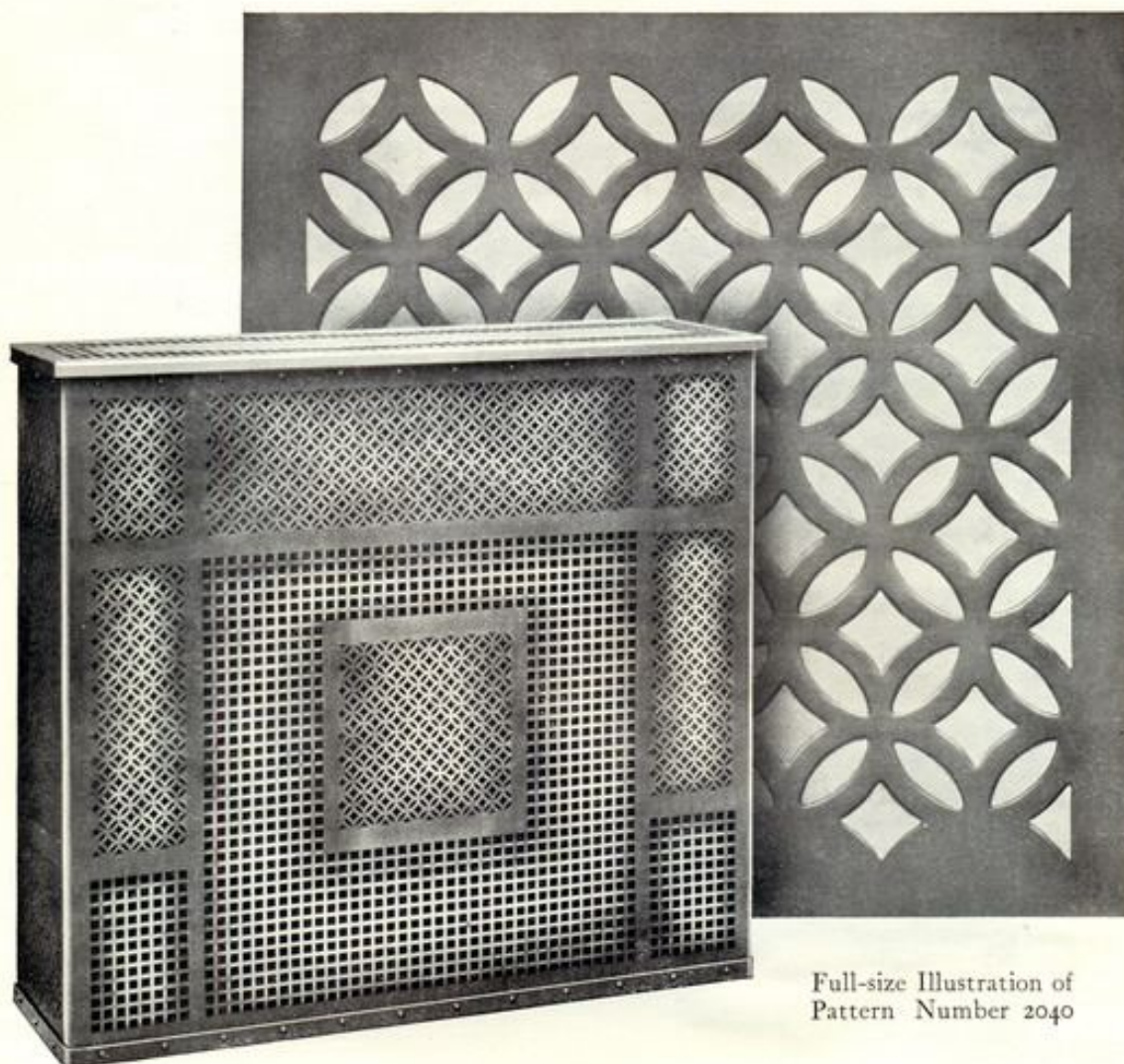

THE "TUDOR" RADIATOR COVER



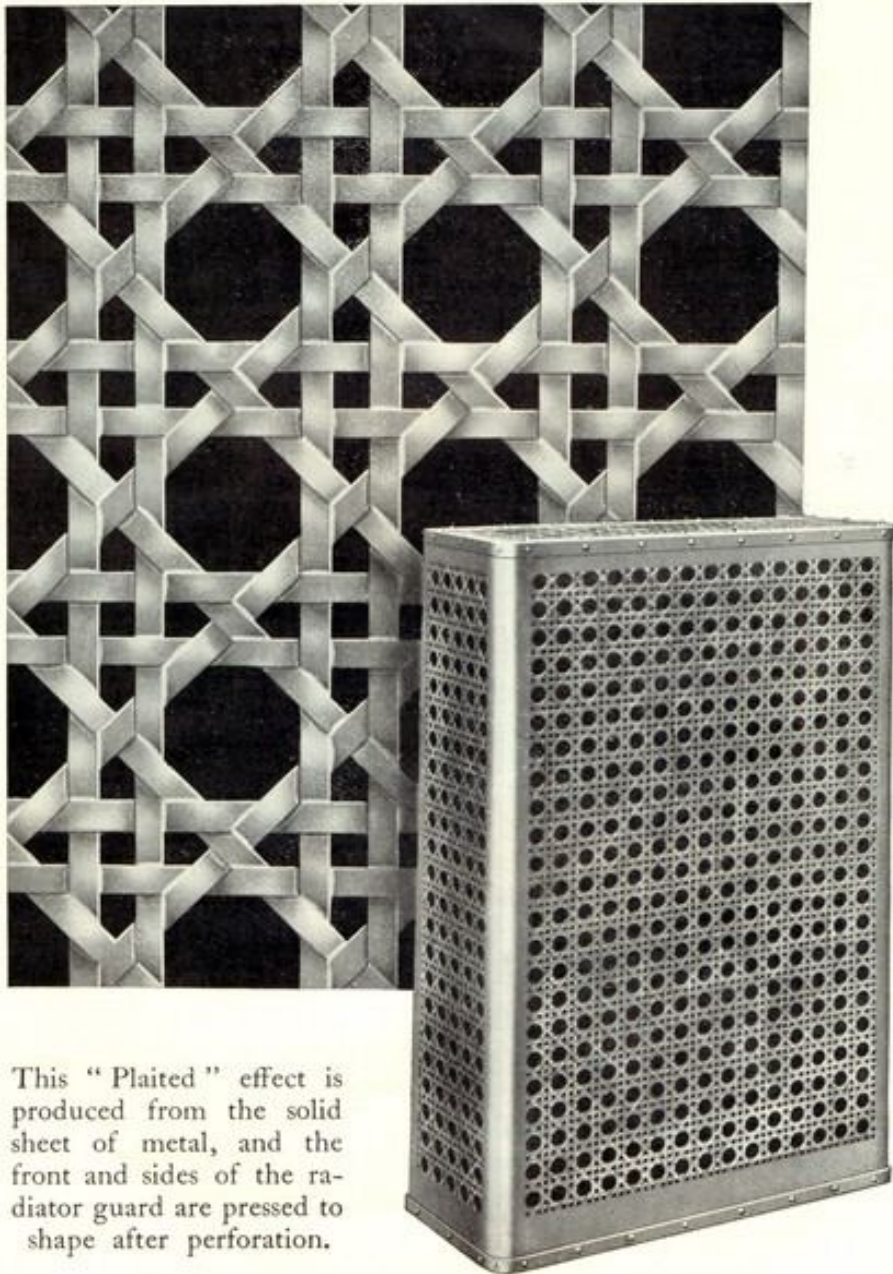

and Full-Size Illustration of "Plaited" Pattern, Number 1477



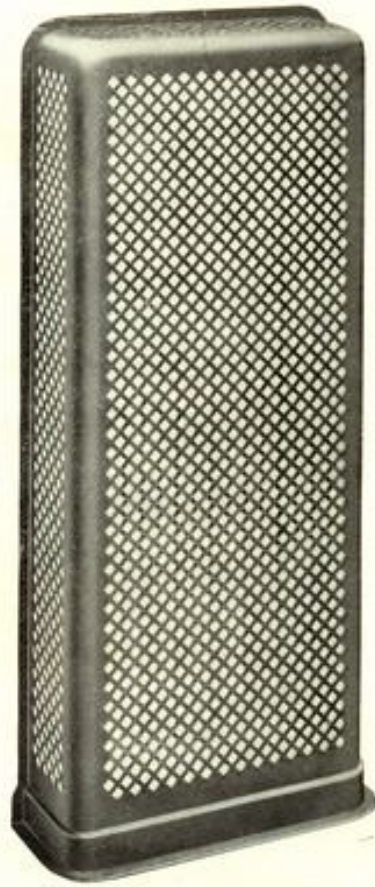
This "Plaited" effect is produced from the solid sheet of metal, and the front and sides of the radiator guard are pressed to shape after perforation.

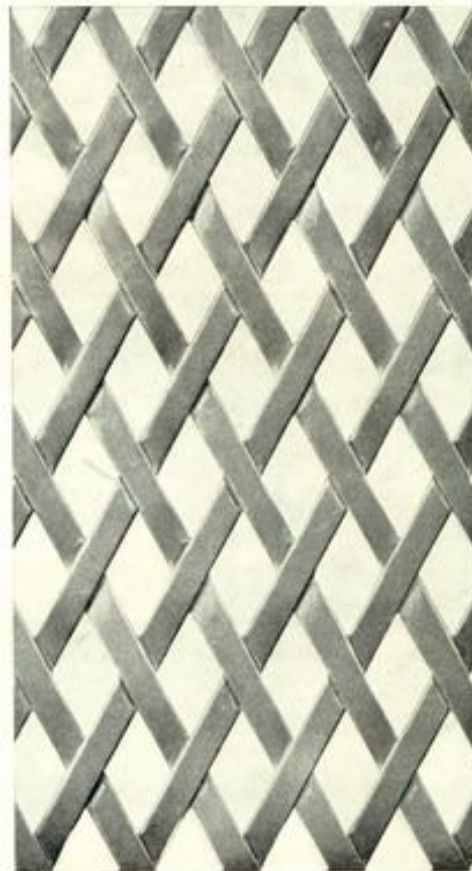
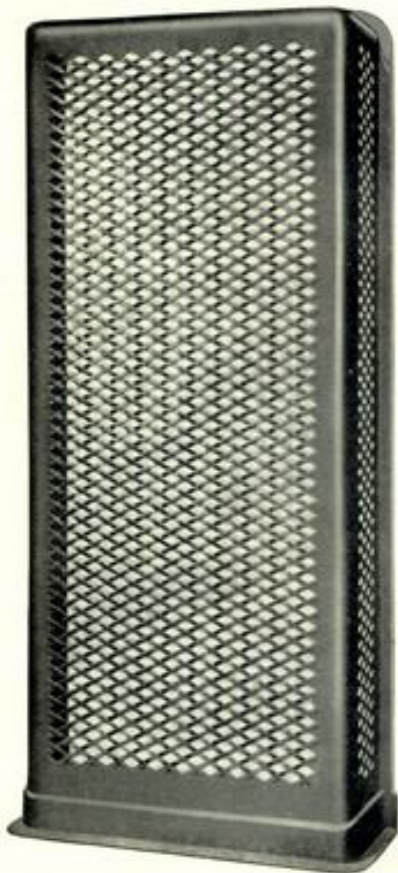


The Diagonal "Plaited" Pattern

This illustrates the Diagonal "Plaited" effect as applied to the specially tall type of radiator guard. The photograph was taken of a cover finished in "Old Silver." Supplied to any depth, width and height to suit individual requirements, and in Bronze, Brass, Copper, etc., as mentioned on page two. This pattern was used for the Duralumin ventilating panels of the R.M.S. "Aquitania."

Full-size Illustration. Pattern No. 1476

THE "WINDSOR" RADIATOR COVER

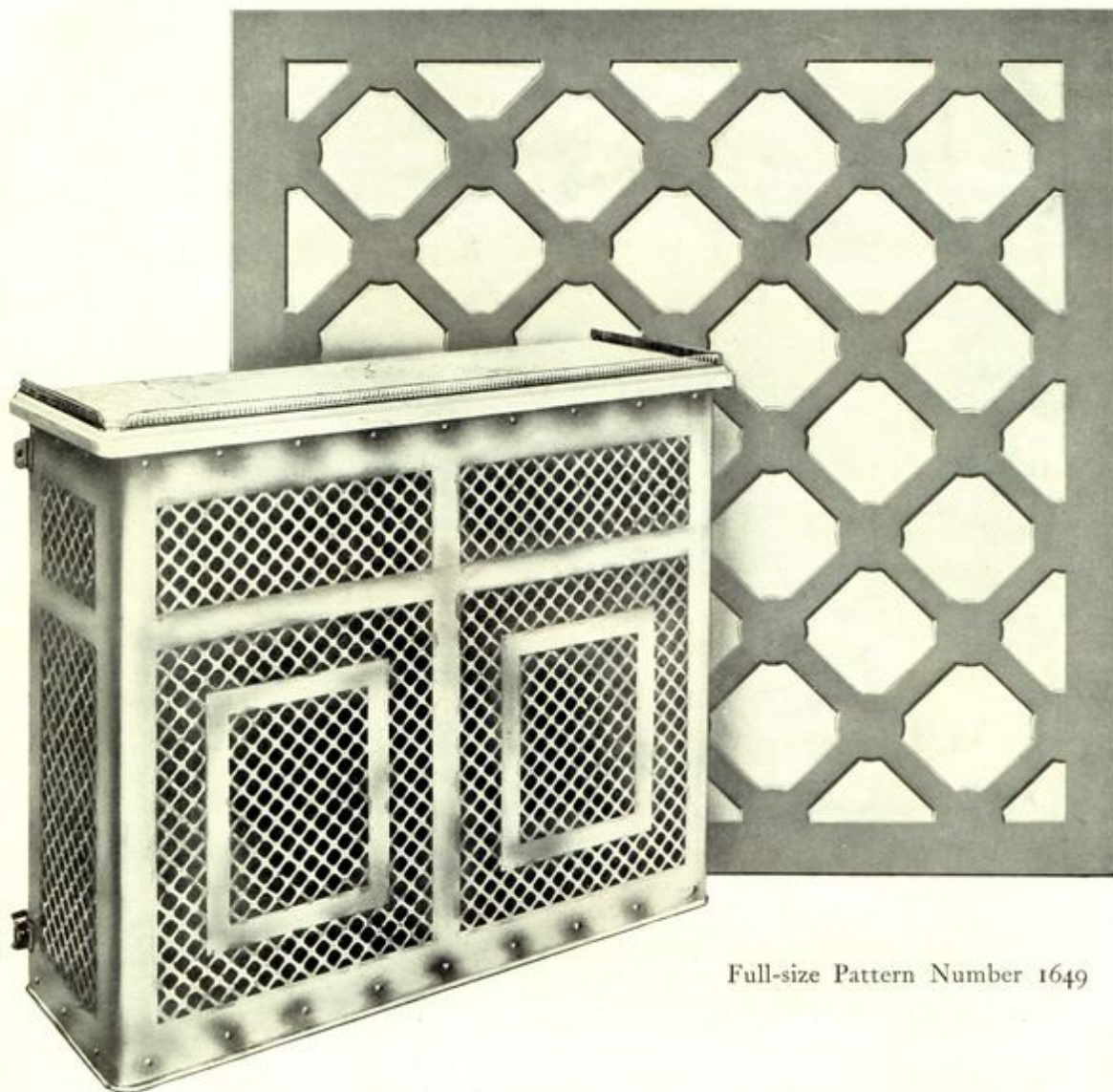


"Rose" Pattern Number 1642

THE "GEORGIAN" RADIATOR COVER

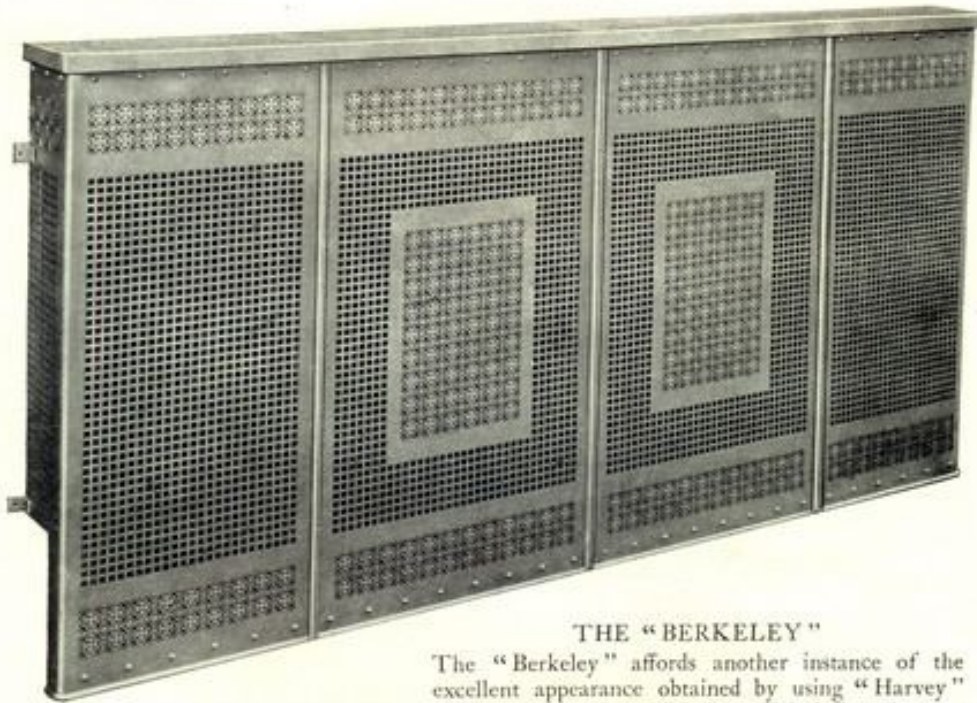


Full-size Pattern Number 1649

The Radiator Cover shewn above, with a full-size reproduction of the pattern used, affords a further specimen of the artistic panelling effect that can be obtained with "Harvey" Perforated Metal. This cover was specially designed and fitted with marble top and surmounted with silver gallery. The whole finished in Oxidised Silver.

THE "BERKELEY"

The "Berkeley" affords another instance of the excellent appearance obtained by using "Harvey" Perforated Metal. This beautiful design shows a further combination of patterns, Nos. 1642 and 1664, with a different motif in the panelling. This Radiator Cover is a creation of great aesthetic charm, and is a most useful addition to any scheme of central heating.



THE "BUCKINGHAM"

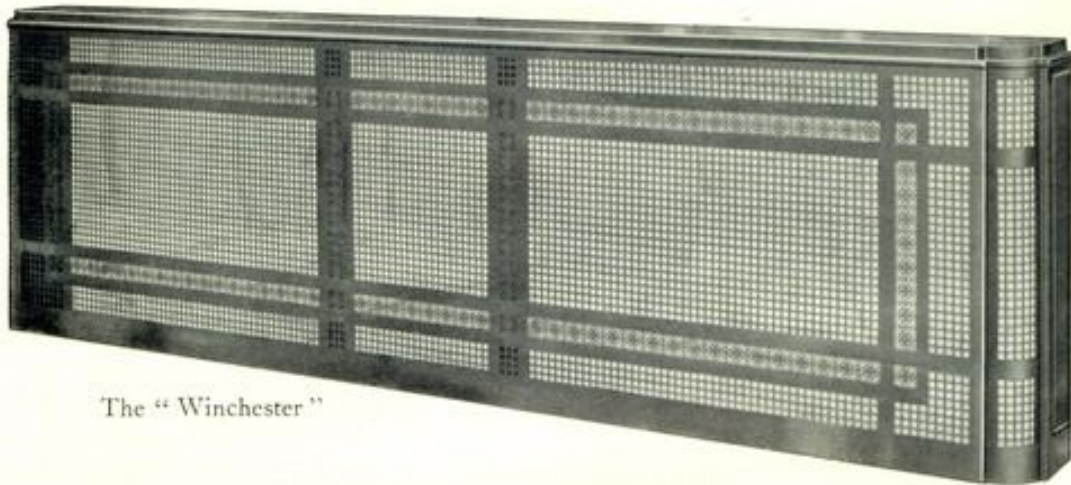
This Radiator Cover, produced in Mild Steel with Oxidised Silver finish, includes in its design a special humidifying tray (which is removable), with hinged cover at top as shewn.

THE "NORMAN"

The "Norman" illustrates another artistic Radiator Cover, which is produced by using two patterns, Nos. 2040 and 1452. This cover is finished in Oxidised Copper, thus adding to the charming effect of the perforated metalwork. All "Harvey" Radiator Covers are designed to permit the free entry of air and its efficient diffusion when warmed.

THE "WINCHESTER"

The "Winchester" is a further example of the combination of Patterns Nos. 1642 and 1664. Although the patterns are identical with those used for the "Berkeley" shewn on the preceding page, another highly artistic design of a quite different character has been produced. It will also be seen that Harvey Perforated Metal affords scope for a wide diversity in panelling effects.

THE "CHELTENHAM"

Designed to enclose the radiator completely, the "Cheltenham" is made of Brass, finished Oxidised Silver. The adaptability of Harvey Perforated Metal to decorative treatment is shewn by the interesting effect which has been produced by taking our pattern No. 1664 for the basis of the design.

The "Sandringham"

THE "SANDRINGHAM"

Contrasted with other radiator covers illustrated in these pages, the simplicity of design shewn in the "Sandringham" exemplifies the wide variety of styles we can produce. But although the perforated design in the "Sandringham" is somewhat severe and restrained, the walnut finish gives a strikingly handsome appearance to this radiator cover.

THE "OXFORD"

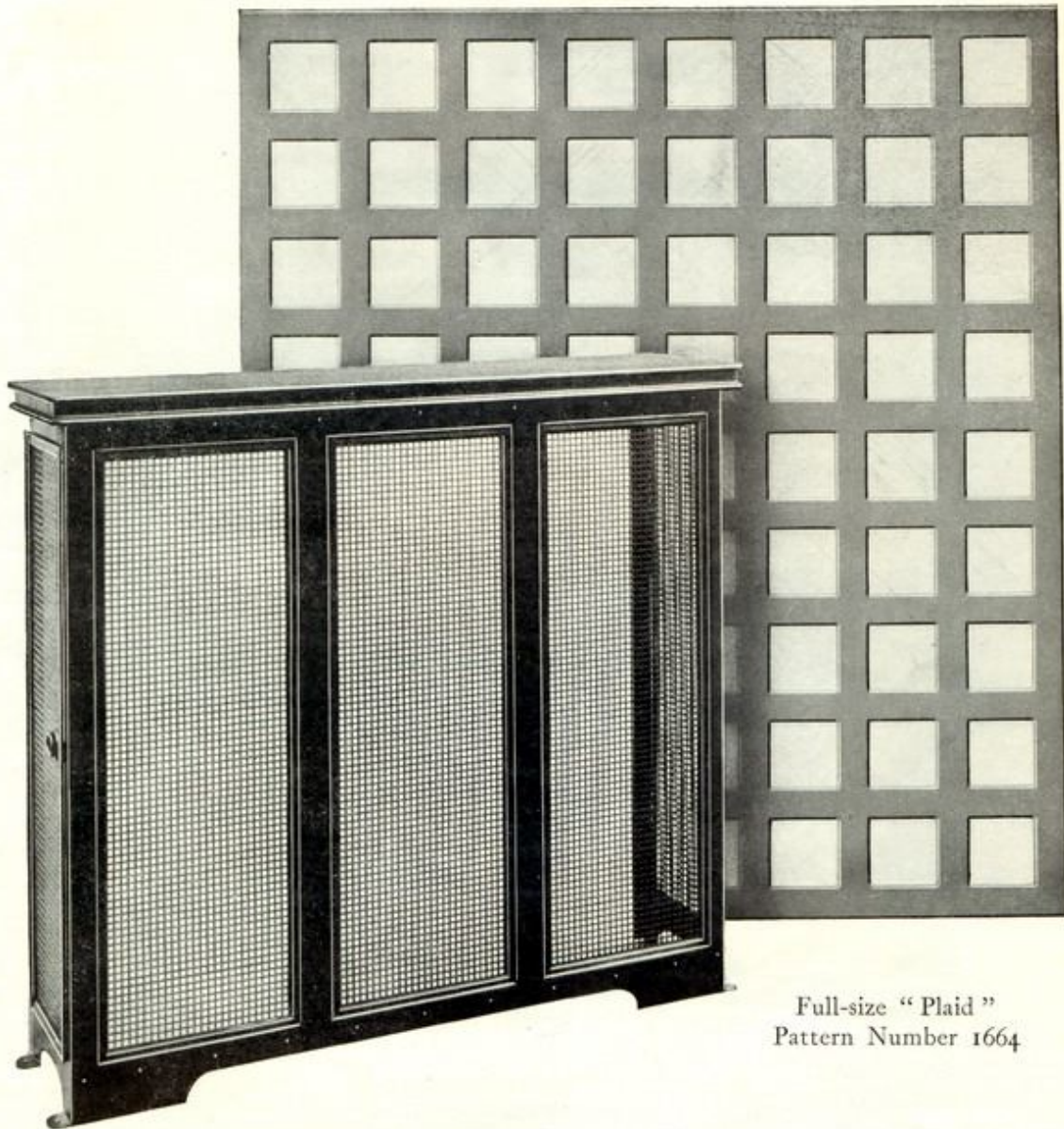
The "Oxford" offers another variation of the two patterns previously illustrated. Harvey Perforated Metalwork, being produced from the solid sheet, combines artistic effect with strength and durability.

Many of the patterns used for Radiator Covers can also be effectively utilised in designs for Grilles and Ventilating Panels, thus enabling architectural unity to be maintained throughout heating and ventilating schemes.

Art Screens for Radiators built into Recesses

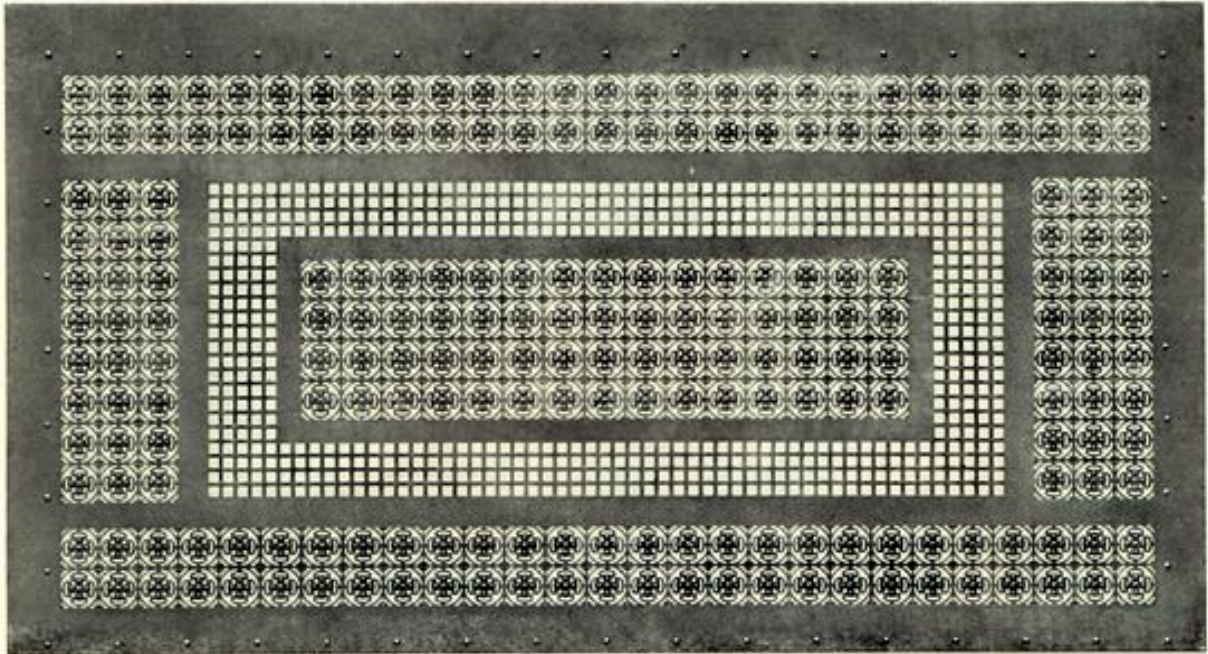

Fig. 400 was finished Antique Dark Bronze and Lacquered ; Fig. 401 in Dark Florentine Bronze and Lacquered ; Fig. 402 in Satin Brass and Lacquered.

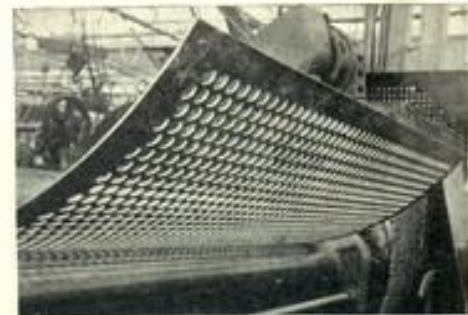
