The first event of the convention was a meeting of the Council which took place at 3 o'clock in the afternoon. At 4 o'clock the members met in general session.

Conditions for an enthusiastic meeting were propitious in that a



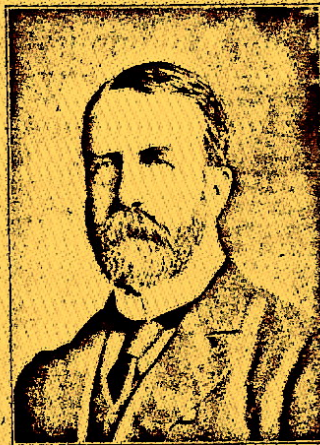
JOHN KITCHEN,

Member of the Council.

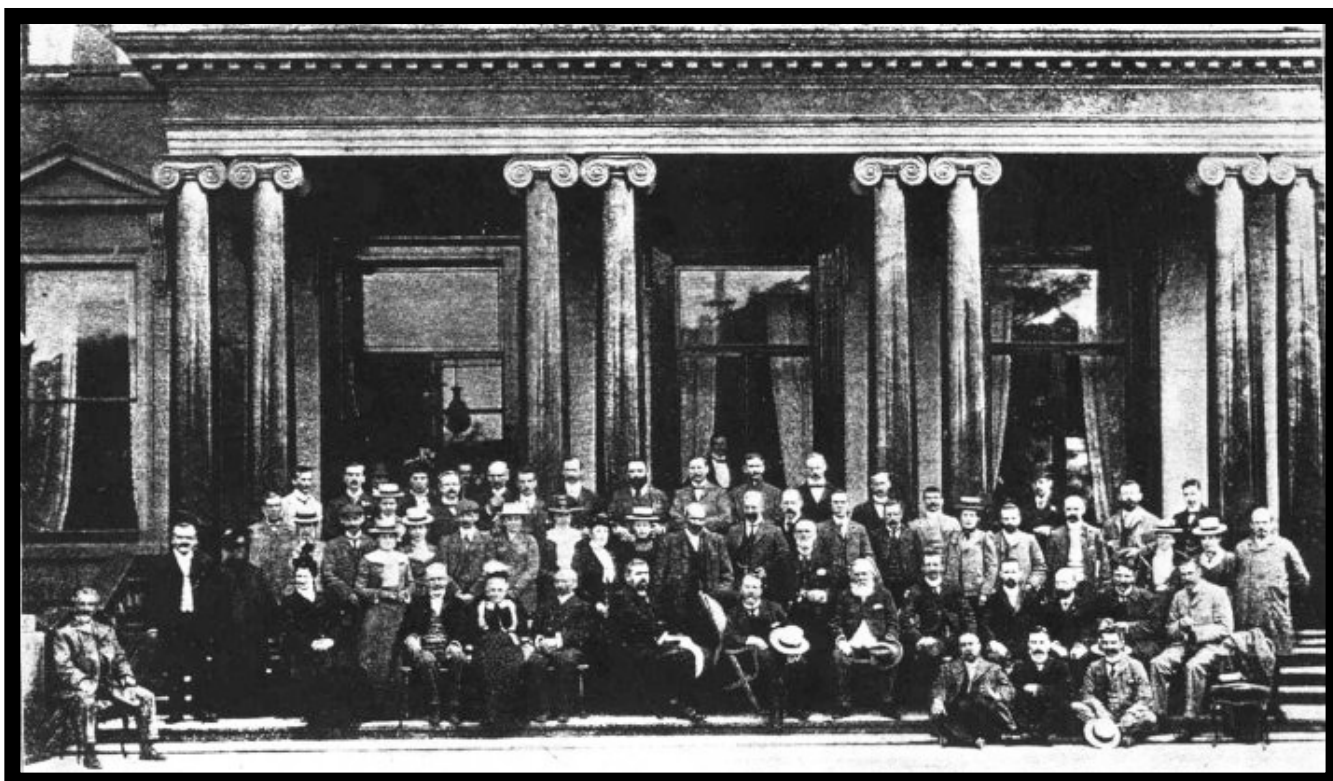

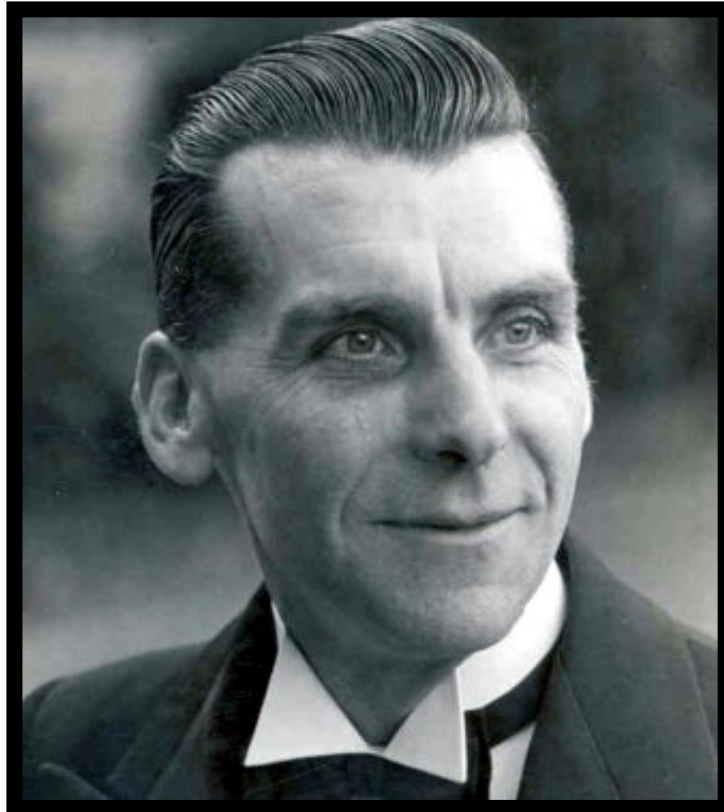

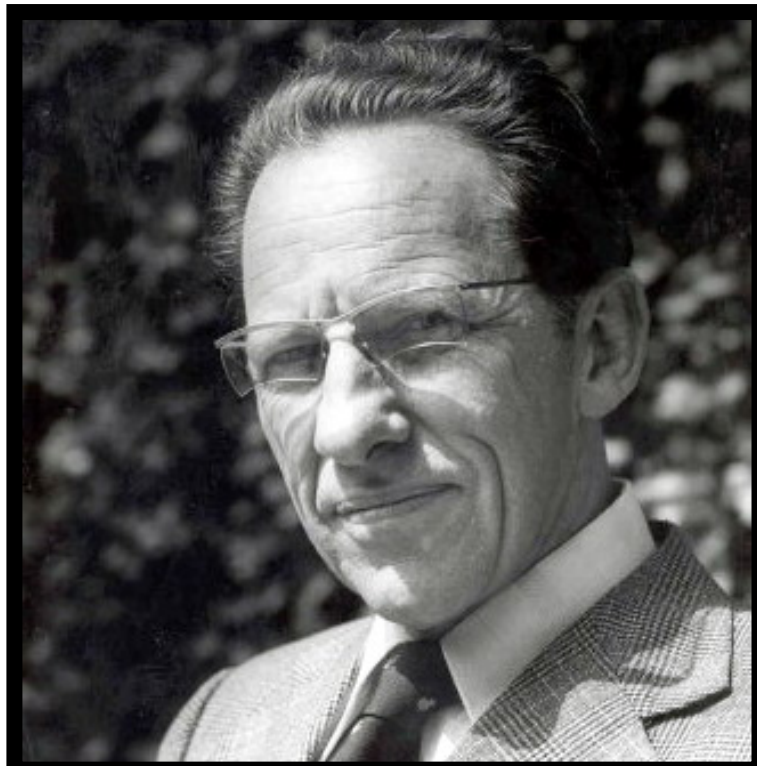
