## **MASTER MASONS & BUILDERS**

But he must carry out the work according to the plan that he has presented to the lords, towns or villages in such a way that the work will not be diminished or lessened in value.
















The Great Model of St Paul's Cathedral, London, made in 1674 of oak and limewood and some eighteen feet long [Wren's London, The Folio Society, 1975]








